

Action Taken Report on the Students feedback Analysis Session - 2021-22

Following actions have been taken on the observations of the IQAC on the student's feedback for the session Jul-Dec 2021:

Sr. No.	Weakness	Action Taken
(i)	Less Encouragement by teachers to participate in extracurricular activities	To enhance student engagement beyond academics, various clubs have been formed. These clubs aim to encourage communication, collaboration, and overall development among students. Faculty members play an active role in motivating and guiding students to participate in these activities, thereby fostering interpersonal and communication skills.
(ii)	How well were the teachers able to communicate	In classes where both Punjabi rural students and international students are enrolled, language barriers were observed, affecting effective teaching and learning. To address this issue, separate sections were formed for national and international students wherever feasible. This initiative was taken to ensure better understanding, inclusivity, and academic performance for all students.
(iii)	Question papers out of syllabus	To maintain academic integrity and ensure syllabus alignment, a formal process has been implemented for question paper analysis. Faculty members are reviewing the question paper within 2-3 days of the conduct of the exam and submit the report through Google Form. In cases where any question is identified as being out of syllabus, the matter is promptly reported to IKGPTU for necessary action.
